## Partnering for Change: Promoting Computer Literacy

#### Who We Are & What We Do

Building on the pioneering role of UNESCO with the introduction of the International Computer Driving License (ICDL) certification program in the Arab region, and due to its overwhelming wide-scale acceptance by the governments in the region, an ICDL regional office was founded in Dubai, UAE in 2004. ICDL Arabia represents a global computer literacy, not for profit cause with the responsibility to solely operate the ICDL program across the GCC, Iraq and Egypt. Working closely with concerned government and private sector partners, the ICDL certification is approved by qualification and educational regulators across the region making it the standard for educational programs, employee training and individuals' digital development.

Our primary goal is to enhance the social and economic wellbeing of citizens in the region through learning of essential ICT skills.

The entire region is experiencing an unprecedented surge in technology adoption with GCC countries boasting the highest Internet growth rate amongst Arab States. The widespread usage of smart devices as well as of social networking sites is also rising rapidly, particularly among the younger generation. This is sparking serious concerns for us as a society to handle these new technologies and be able safeguard our children from the threats posed by the Internet. Educators and parents have a very important responsibility and guidance role to play. They must raise awareness by talking to children about becoming smart and vigilant online, but first they must be digitally aware and qualified to raise such a subject.

With protecting children from becoming victims of cybercrime being a national priority, ICDL Arabia doubled up on its commitment to the region spearheading initiatives that aim to educate the general public. By focusing on promoting digital awareness and Cyber Safety, primarily targeting students, teachers, parents, women groups, job seekers, orphans and economically disadvantaged individuals, across the region, we have managed to form partnerships that engage government organizations, educational institutions, and corporate citizens, all in support of community outreach initiatives.



#### **Our Community Outreach Initiatives**

At ICDL Arabia, we are committed to making a real difference in fostering the computer skills & building the capabilities and Cyber Safety awareness among citizens of the GCC, Iraq and Egypt. We promote various initiatives that focus on the local youth, parents, women groups, job seekers, orphans and economically disadvantaged individuals. Our Community Outreach Initiatives consist of three main categories focusing on community outreach and impact: 1) ICDL Summer Camp, 2) Women's Enablement, and 3) Job-Nationalization.

#### >> ICDL Youth Summer Camp

ICDL Summer Camp is an annual regional event that started in 2001 as an initiative to spread digital skills and Cyber safety among children between the ages of 14 - 18. The various Summer Camps are overseen by ICDL Arabia and typically run by ICDL accredited centres at universities due to their multiple campus locations, availability of state-of-the-art computer labs, dining facilities and transportation; whilst providing young school students with orientation to the higher education learning environment.

ICDL Summer Camp aims to educate future generations on the responsible and safe use of technology in a fun yet constructive environment. The 2013 Summer Camp provided students with the basic and essential computer skills and practical knowledge skills of how to leverage Social Media platforms to meet social, educational and informational objectives. The Camp gave students a chance to socialize with youngsters of a similar age in an edutaining environment. Valuable presents and surprises were also offered to participants from the generous support of our esteemed sponsors.

The Summer Camp concept all started with the endorsement and support of visionary country leaders and policymakers from the Government educational sectors across the GCC member states. The success of this good-cause initiative remains to be contingent on the generosity and support, whether in funds or in-kind, received from Governments of the region and also industries such as media, technology, airline, recreation, banking, oil, telecom and hospitality.

Through Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR), Community Engagement and Government support, ICDL Summer Camp has to-date, successfully empowered more than 60,000 youth with digital skills, giving them a sense of achievement and enabling them to become resourceful, motivated and independent learners.

#### >>> Role-Model Supporter: HSBC a Key Contributor to our Summer Camp Community Outreach Initiative



HSBC is one of the world's largest banking and financial services organizations, and has been operating in the Middle East since 1959. It initiated this particular Strategic Initiative by renewing their partnership with ICDL Summer Camp for the second year in a row to empower 200 orphans and underprivileged youngsters from the Emirates of Ajman, Fujairah, Ras Al Khaimah and Sharjah with essential skills in social media and cyber safety.

Although funding was made available, a project like this involves several parties and delicate coordination to ensure its success. Hence, with the support of HSBC, ICDL Arabia's role was to:

- 1) Identify the underprivileged and orphan children that qualify to receive the HSBC grant to participate in the summer program.
- 2) Select suitable ICDL accredited centres that have the capability and capacity to deliver this project.
- **3)** Create incentives to ensure that the young participants remain interested to eventually be prepared for the certification test.
- 4) Raise awareness on the proper use of Social Media.

The Initiative was a great success with a total number of 200 underprivileged and orphan students who made productive use of their summer break to acquire new computer skills that led them to ICDL certification. The generosity of HSBC is now a model case study we present to responsible corporate citizens to consider supporting similar initiatives targeting underprivileged, orphan children or other minority groups such as, women, retirees, job seekers, people of special needs or prison inmates.

This project demonstrates the beneficial outcome of strong collaboration between so many parties that have joined hands towards one goal – to provide underprivileged and orphan children with an educational and productive summer.

# Partnering for Change: Promoting Computer Literacy

#### >> Women's Fnablement

To date, ICDL Arabia has enrolled more than a million individuals in its programs, including women. ICDL Arabia Initiatives enable local women homemakers and women with varying disabilities, such as deafness and partial paralysis, to gain valuable skills leveraging ICDL's internationally recognized, quality standards. The specially adapted ICDL procedures and standards cater to women with special needs by including additional hours of practice as well as test retakes and extended test period duration.

In 2012, the Abu Dhabi Systems & Information Centre (ADSIC) launched, in cooperation with ICDL Arabia, an Initiative called eCitizen programme aimed at enabling thousands of women lacking the necessary skills to effectively use Internet for transactions, eServices and accessing information/services provided by the Abu Dhabi eGovernment and other online platforms.

Also in 2013, ICDL Arabia joined forces with University of Sharjah to launch an Initiative to empower women with physical disabilities to learn ICT skills. The program was implemented by University of Sharjah with the aim of educating deaf and partially paralysed women from "Sharjah City for Humanitarian Services".

**The Women's Enablement Projects** educates and empowers women with digital skills and cyber safety guidance to participate across all sectors in the society which is essential to build a stronger society and improve the quality of life for women. These projects are the result of collaboration between ICDL Arabia, governments in the region and responsible corporate citizens.

#### >> Job-Nationalization

ICDL Arabia has anchored itself closely to key Government initiatives such as Emiratisation from the onset in order to make a real difference in terms of employment and learning for local citizens, particularly job seekers. Ensuring Dubai's public servants have strong computer skills is a priority. His Highness Sheikh Mohammad bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Ruler of Dubai and Prime Minister of the UAE, made a decree in 2005 for an initiative to train UAE nationals working as public servants so they can obtain the International Computer Driving License (ICDL) certification. In line with this decree and Emiratisation policies across all Emirates, more than 200,000 UAE nationals have completed ICDL certification requirements.

Learning new skills in using information and communications technologies (ICT) has resulted in improved employment opportunities and quality of life, key cornerstones of Emiratisation.
