We plan to have approximately five additional accredited centres operating at our onshore locations so that employees can learn with ease, knowing that the IT training they receive is close by and flexible to use," stated Al-Marzouqi.

Mr. Rich MacLaren, Program Director, ICDL UAE, said: "The endorsement of the ICDL program by ADCO is yet another milestone in the national implementation of a unified standard for computer literacy in the UAE. ICDL has already been endorsed locally by Dubai e-Government, the Ministry of Education, and several other federal ministries as well as all the major colleges and universities in the country. Each individual who successfully completes the ICDL training program will receive a certificate that is recognized internationally with employers and educational institutions around the world."

"Our partnership with ADCO is a strong message indicative of international companies who are adopting and implementing the ICDL program across departments and organisations throughout the region," added Mr. MacLaren.
