## Qatar Islamic Cultural Centre (Fanar) adopts ICDL program

## An international standard to raise the IT competency of advocates and employees

April 28, 2009 The Qatar Islamic Cultural Centre (Fanar), an organization supervised by the Ministry of Endowments and Islamic Affairs, has announced that it has become a certified International Computer Driving License (ICDL) Training and Testing Center. The certification is funded by the Qatar Endowments Authority and will be acquired in cooperation with ICDL GCC Foundation, the governing body and certification authority of the ICDL program in the GCC Countries and Iraq.

As per the terms of agreement that was signed at ICDL GCC Foundation Dubai head office, Fanar will adopt the ICDL program as an international standard to identify the basic skills required to become IT proficient in using computers according to the comprehensive training and development plan developed to enhance the competency of the centre's staff, including Muslim advocates and administrative employees, the vision of both Fanar and the Ministry will be achieved, as the plan aims to improve service quality and corporate performance.
