ZADCO and ICDL extend their 3-year partnership with accrediting a remote offshore ICDL centre in ZIRKU Island

Oil company's offshore workforce to undergo world-class computer literacy certification

Zakum Development Company (ZADCO), a major Abu Dhabi-based oil company, has announced that it will extend its 3-year partnership agreement with ICDL GCC Foundation, the governing body of the ICDL certification program in the Gulf Region, to cover its offshore workforce. This is also our own contribution to national and regional efforts towards the establishment of a knowledgebased economy."

The ICDL certification program offers an efficient and world-class approach to providing basic computer skills that will help the workforce keep pace with this growth.
